Joe F, there is no rule of thumb. Some prefer to turn a tenon and compress the chuck onto it. In the UK they prefer to turn a recess and expand their chuck into the recess. If either could cause an issue with your work as it gets thinner, you want to do the other. Example, there is a small crack across what will be the bottom you'll want to use a tenon. Does that help?
